

What has the workers' representative for safety to do?

- ①
 - has access to working places;
 - collects information about the evaluation of risks, the preventive measures, the substances employed, the equipment, the accidents and occupational diseases;
- ②
 - is consulted to evaluate risks, to choose preventive measures and to implement them;
 - is consulted to appoint the people responsible for the services of prevention, protection, first aid, fire prevention and to organise the professional training;
- ③
 - receives an adequate professional training;
 - gives opinions and receives information from the services of prevention and safety in working places of the local authority for health (A.U.S.L.);
- ④
 - takes part in the periodical meetings with the employer and the responsible for the service of prevention and protection within the firm;
 - makes suggestions on the preventive measures to implement;
- ⑤
 - can apply to the public authority if he finds that the measures carried out in the firm are not suitable;
 - has access to the official documents on the evaluation of risks and the register of accidents.

The workers' duties

⑥ Each worker has to take care of his/her own safety, his/her own health and of the health of the other workers, who can be hurt by his/her actions and omissions. This must occur in compliance with the training, the instructions and the available means supplied by the employer.

⑦ In particular workers must:

- follow the employer's instructions;
- use correctly
 - engines, tools and equipment
 - dangerous substances
 - means of transport
 - security devices;
- must not move safety devices without being authorised,
- must not carry out actions outside their tasks.
- report to the employer, the manager and the responsible for safety the possible inefficiency of the plants and inform the workers' representative for safety;
- undergo the periodical checks which are provided for them;
